

Situation Overview:

The recent flash flood in Rasuwa have caused significant damage and loss of life. As of the latest updates from NDRRMA situation report-5, the death toll stands at 157, 826 still missing. Rescue operations are ongoing, and the government has activated a multi-agency response to assess the damage and provide relief. The situation remains critical, and authorities are urging residents to stay informed and follow safety guidelines.

So far, 165 bodies have been found in the flood-affected areas, yet to be identified. In the flood-affected areas, 44 personnel from the Nepal Army, 28 from the local police posts, and 13 from the Armed Police Force Nepal have been deployed. According to the Nepal Aviation Board, preliminary reports say a total of 579 people including 466 foreigners and 113 Nepalese passengers, are missing from the affected areas. From Tamure in Rasuwa, 123 people were airlifted, including 94 Nepalis and 29 foreigners. Due to the floods, 35 motorable bridges, 45 suspension bridges, and 40 kilometers of road are damaged. The collection of details regarding human and physical losses is ongoing. Travel has been discouraged on: Prithvi Highway, Galchhi-Nuwakot-Rasuwa-Syabrubesi Road, Muglin.

NRCS Response

• Initial Rapid Assessment (IRA) orientation

15 volunteers in Nuwakot oriented on IRA and have been mobilized for the data collection in the affected areas.

• Restoring Family Link (RFL) Services:

Help desk established at Nuwakot supporting them to connect with their relatives through phone call

- 25 Dead body bag handed over to Kalimati Police
- 75 Dead body bag dispatched to Chitwan from Birgunj warehouse
- 150 dead body bag handed over to APF hospital
- 200 dead body bag handed over to HEOC

• Ready to eat food (RTEFs) distributed to 750 people.

(RTEFs include Noodles 1 packet, Biscuits 1 packet beaten rice 200 gram, Drinking water 1 bottle Per Person)
